Re 2:

The purpose of the Network is to improve the capacity and prioritisation of Danish CSOs and other relevant actors to integrate conflict prevention and peacebuilding in their programme work.

The focus is therefore not to do advocacy, but this can happen as a consequence of several organisations agreeing on specific advocacy issues, and taking it further - together or separately - through their respective organisations.

The Network has successfully implemented 7 activities and has 7 more in the pipeline. The work has gained a lot of interest, eg by the DK MFA.

Updates on the network membership: 69 members and growing. 13 members from 6 organisations in coordination group.



Re 3:

The charter has been approved by participating members with few implications, as follows:

There is a pressing deadline for development funds from Global Fokus, April 15th, and if the deadline has not been reached, second round for fund application is October 15th.

Slack is going to be used as a platform for communication in the network. Kristian (RIKO) is working on implementing it as a default platform for inter-communications.
